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

本校策劃全方位學習周時,考慮全面。因應活動場地的安全性、時間安排、學習内容、與常規課程的相關性 及學牛興趣等,本年度共舉辦了七個海外交流團,包括:「台中與阿里山可持續發展考察之旅」、「西安敦煌藝術 文化之旅」、「台灣排球之旅」、「夢想啟航:英倫之路・升學與職涯新篇」、「泰南愛心服侍之旅」、「東京文化自主 探索交流團」及「創新探索:荷蘭STEAM之旅」,足跡遍及歐亞。此外,亦有十三項本地活動。全方位學習活動 特色如下:

擴寬學生可持續發展的視野

中三至中五級師牛前往荷蘭考察,收穫甚豐。學牛走訪當地不同的科技中心、創新企業和文化 景點,從而了解當地環保科技、都市規劃和可持續的農業。這些考察活動激發學生在可持續性發展及 STEAM領域的興趣和創新思維。學生從探訪阿姆斯特丹球場中,了解關於體育設施的尖端技術,包括 能源效率和廢物管理。透過參觀漂浮農場,學生們明白可持續農業、水上耕作技術以及當地食品系統 的重要性。我們相信,這些體驗能夠為學生未來投身於工程學、生物學和環境科學奠定堅實基礎。

另一個特色的活動是台中與阿里山可持續發展考察之旅,師生先後參觀高美濕地和台積電中科 生態園區,藉此認識生態系統、理解可持續發展的概念及關注生物多樣性和資源安全,培養學生環境 保護的意識。學校亦安排二十名學生領袖到訪東京交流。學生參觀了池袋防災館及體驗防災活動,並 學習在地震、火災和濃煙的緊急環境下挑生的步驟。此外,領袖和琦玉縣高中學生進行交流,當日氣氛 愉悅,學牛收穫豐富。



本校在全方位學習周加入職業導向元素,幫助學生了解未來就業市場,促使他們思考職業規劃 學校舉辦交流團的目標並非單純旅遊觀光,而是希望拓展學生的視野,使他們認識到各行各業的發展 機會,為未來的生涯規劃提供新的方向。

「夢想啟航:英倫之路,升學與職涯新篇」計劃的核心在於協助學生了解外國及大學文化。學校 特意安排學生參觀牛津大學及與倫敦帝國學院交流。透過該校的學生導覽和本校學生的互動,除了 提升迦南學生的英語能力,也促進他們對文化多樣性的認同與欣賞,一舉兩得。

學校職學定向組亦安排中三至中五學生到訪本地職場,包括參觀消防局、飛機維修廠、咖啡室、 環保工業設施,引導學生建立正確的職業規劃觀念,明確他們的目標和發展方向,同時探索各種職業 道路的可能性。

牧養學生成為領袖

學校提供循序漸進的全方位教育營,初中舉辦成長營,旨在通過團隊合作、戶外挑戰等項目,培養 學生的團隊精神、領導才能、紀律性、責任感及抗逆能力,這與本校提倡的全人教育的目標一致。學校 鼓勵中三至中五生在三年裡最少到外地交流一次,體驗異地文化,培養自立和自律精神。

捅過帶領學生參加各種學習經歷和境內外活動,例如排球集訓和友誼賽、攀石訓練班以及當代 舞蹈體驗,學生能夠拓展視野,增強自我形象和生命素質,培養良好品格,並以尊重和認真的態度對待 他人。老師還帶領中三級至中五級學生,進行探訪泰國南部弱勢兒童和家庭、派送物資給當地貧窮村民、 探訪醫院病人等愛心服侍,傳揚神的愛及體會服務他人的喜樂。

「東京文化自主探索交流團」其中有兩天是以1:5的師生比例分為若干小組進行,同學需與帶隊 老師一同討論及安排每天的學習重點、行程、飲食安排等。這除提升溝通技巧、培養解難能力外,還培養 學生成為具前瞻性及策劃的領袖。

我們相信,這些探索和交流不僅增強了學生的知識和技能,更培養了他們的責任感和對社會的 關懷。而這本特刊,相信將成為師生共同的美好回憶。





At the 921 Earthquake Education Center, we learned about the devastating 1999 earthquake through preserved structures and interactive exhibits, deepening our understanding of earthquakes and disaster prevention. At Alishan, we marveled at ancient sacred trees, gaining awe for nature's power, and witnessed a breathtaking sunrise, appreciating the beauty and significance of patience and preservation.

The most memorable part of this trip was visiting the Sacred Tree Forest and witnessing the sunrise at Zhushan. At the Sisters Lakes, the serene reflections and the cultural legend highlighted the harmony between nature and heritage. 



Innovate & Explore: The Dutch STEAM Journey

April 7th to April 14th

From April 7th to 14th, 2025, 30 students embarked on the Dutch STEAM Study Tour, guided by Mr. York Yip, Mr. Howard Ho, and Ms. Peggy Wong, to explore Amsterdam and Rotterdam and discover the integration of sustainability, innovation, and STEAM concepts.

The journey began with a canal cruise, offering insights into Amsterdam's urban planning and architecture. At the National Aviation Museum, students explored the evolution of flight, while the Johan Cruijff ArenA highlighted sustainable sports infrastructure to students.

Students toured a Diamond Factory and admired masterpieces at the Rijksmuseum. At De Ceuvel, they learned about renewable energy and circular design. In Rotterdam, visits to the Cube House and Floating Farm showcased creative architecture and sustainable agriculture.


